Inside millage is not voted millage - it is determined by the Ohio Constitution and is not subject to reduction factors from House Bill 920.				
Voters have approved 77.70 mills (voted millage) or 81.60 mills less the inside millage of 3.90 mills.				
The voted millage of 77.70 mills has been reduced under the provisions of House Bill 920 to 39.36 mills (effective millage.)				
Voted mills are the mills that taxpayers have approved but the effective mills are what is actually collected.				
The 1.9 mill Capital Improvement levy (voted millage) is a permanent improvement levy that is used only for improvements to the buildings and grounds. The effective millage is 1.33 after HB 920 reductions.
